<b>Summary</b>	Students gain an understanding of Latin as a language that has influenced all of European science and culture, and of ancient culture as the culture that underlies European civilization. The subjects of study include phonetics, morphology (noun, adjective, verb, and adverb), and syntax of the Latin language; students become familiar with the specifics of the Latin grammatical system in general through its comparison with the grammars of Russian and European languages.
<b>Formed competencies, learning outcomes</b>	Basic professional competencies: <b>to know:</b> the main levels of the Latin language as a system: phonetics, morphology, syntax, vocabulary in the volume of lexical minimums; to be able to: independently analyze, translate and interpret original Latin texts using a dictionary and grammar tables. <b>to possess:</b> the skill of using educational, scientific and reference literature on the subject.
