Summary	Lexicology as a science about the vocabulary of a language. The lexical meaning of a word and its internal form. Typology of lexical meanings. Polysemy as a manifestation of the law of economy in language. Ways of developing new meanings of words. Lexical homonymy in Russian. Types of lexical homonyms by origin: etymological, semantic, word-formation. Lexical synonymy and antonymy in Russian. Vocabulary of the Russian language from the point of view of origin. Borrowings from Slavic languages. Old Church Slavonicisms and their features. Borrowings from classical, Turkic and Western European languages; Vocabulary of the Russian language from the point of view of active and passive stock; historicisms, archaisms, neologisms; dialectal, specialized and slang vocabulary; vocabulary of official-business, journalistic, scientific and colloquial styles; features of phraseological units; semantic classification of phraseological units.
