Modern phonetic processes. Combinatorial and positional changes in sounds. Syllable as a unit of division of the speech flow. Sonorant theory. Division of sounds by ascending sonority. Types of syllables in modern Russian. Syllables by position in a word, by the beginning and end of a syllable, in relation to stress. Syllable division in the Russian language. Stress and intonation in modern Russian. The concept of a phoneme. The system of phonemes of the Russian language. The concept of a norm in orthoepy. Characteristics of the main norms of Russian literary pronunciation. Graphics as a section of the science of language. The concept of spelling.
